The Northside Cultural District will also offer visitors and residents of Jefferson Park access to a public café in a partnership with Jefferson Memorial Park Advisory Council and provide support to the renowned local Jefferson Park storefront theater, the Gift Theatre.

The Northside Cultural District development was designed by John Ronan Architects, an internationally recognized design firm based in Chicago. Financing was facilitated by IFF, a Community Development Financial Institution, and supported by Arts Alliance Illinois, a statewide multidisciplinary organization dedicated to the strengthening of arts and culture across Illinois.


About the Northside Cultural District:


